In The Classroom

- ❖ In math workshop, we will continue to work with mixed numbers and improper fractions, making sure they draw and <u>label</u> visual models to support their thinking. They will also be expected to <u>clearly explain</u> how to convert mixed numbers into improper fractions. Then, students will move onto adding and subtracting mixed numbers with like denominators within word problems.
- In reading workshop, we will continue to work small groups using reciprocal teaching. Students will take turns applying predicting, questioning, clarifying, and summarizing skills while reading a differentiated news article. We will also be reading Chapters 6-8 in Mrs. Frisby and the Rats of NIMH. Please note that students may be asked to respond to critical questions about the read aloud instead of their regular reading responses for homework on certain days.
- In writing workshop, students will begin the final performance task for the persuasive writing unit. Over 4-5 days, they will be taking notes while watching two videos and reading two articles. Then using their notes, students will plan and draft their essays on whether or not standardized testing should continue in New York City. Keep in mind, they will not be expected to publish (rewrite) their piece, but instead write the essay as if they were taking the ELA exam and making revisions directly within their draft.
