## In The Classroom

* In math workshop, students will begin reviewing multiplication facts to practice for instant recall. They will each have a bag of fact triangles that should be used to practice at home as well. Then, we will also spend some time breaking down whole numbers into factors and finding common factors or the greatest common factor shared by two whole numbers.
* In reading workshop, students will continue discussing what makes a good reading response. They will spend some time reading short texts and then practicing on how to write a threeparagraph reading response using a checklist.
* In writing workshop, students will be deciding on which narrative to publish. From this point forward, they will be making revisions on that draft. Students will be focused on using details to vividly describe the setting and adding transition words to help move their readers to the important part in their narrative.

Homework is an important part of elementary school.
