## In The Classroom

- In math workshop, students will continue breaking down whole numbers into factors and finding common factors and the greatest common factor shared by two numbers. They will then work on finding the first twelve multiples of a number and the least common multiple of two numbers.
- In reading workshop, students will be reinforcing their skills in writing about their reading. They will continue reading short texts and then practicing how to write a reading response that has all of its appropriate parts (e.g., introduction, answering the question, textual evidence, conclusion, recommendation) by using a checklist.
- In writing workshop, students will be revising their personal narrative drafts. They will be making sure that their draft has an exciting lead and an insightful ending as well as other narrative elements (i.e., dialogue, interesting details, character description, and setting description). Students will also look to add specific and strong action verbs throughout their drafts.
