In The Classroom

- ❖ In math workshop, we will wrap up the unit on number sense and operations with a summative performance task and then begin the unit on fractions with an initial performance task. Students will also spend time reviewing foundational concepts of fractions (i.e., adding and subtracting fractions of like denominators).
- ❖ In **reading workshop**, students will continue gathering facts and taking notes on nonfiction passages and videos, but this time through a specific lens of a given topic (i.e., the issue of bringing lunch from home). They will work to understand that sometimes, passages will offer both sides of an issue, but it is still necessary for readers to form their own opinions on the issue.
- In writing workshop, students will continue working on writing about the issue of whether or not homework should be banned. They will learn what makes an engaging introduction and proper conclusion for a persuasive essay and then begin to draft them for their own essays. This will be the first persuasive essay that students will publish for this unit! (This unit was created with many mini-publications throughout. Don't worry! We will have a Publishing Party at the end of the unit.)
