In The Classroom

- ❖ In math workshop, we will continue to review for the upcoming state exam using the Ready New York CCLS materials. Students will work on how to measure an angle correctly, draw an angle with a protractor, add/subtract angles to find unknown angles, and identify and draw points line segments, lines, rays. Also, they will take a practice test on the short-response/extended response section so that they will have a better handle how to pace themselves during the actual exam.
- ❖ In reading workshop, we will be doing shared reading of various short stories from Cynthia Rylant's Every Living Thing. Students will be using these texts to study different story elements, describe how a character change, and analyze what was the catalyst for that change. In read aloud, we will continue reading Chapters 23-25 of Mrs. Frisby and the Rats of NIMH.
- ❖ In writing workshop, we will be responding to those short stories by writing responses of at least three paragraphs. Students review what makes a good response and focus more on answering the given prompt instead of a lengthy summary. They will also learn how to annotate the text in a way that helps them plan for a stronger piece.
