In The Classroom

- ❖ In math workshop, we will continue working with angles and thinking about the relationship they have with turns within a circle. Students will then work on solving angle addition/subtraction and angle word problems. They will also learn about line symmetry in order to identify the many lines of symmetry within any regular polygon. In addition, students will practice on multi-digit multiplication and division strategies using Ready New York CCLS materials.
- ❖ In reading workshop, we will re-launch our guided reading groups and have a close reading on this week's Scholastic News feature article ("Bees Feel the Sting"). In read aloud, we will continue reading Chapters 20-22 of Mrs. Frisby and the Rats of NIMH and find out the logistics of "Plan".
- ❖ In writing workshop, we are still reviewing how to cite and quote text sources so that they can be sure that those aspects of writing were included in their pieces. Students will then complete a performance task for the Informational Writing unit. The next unit will involve reading fictional short stories and writing essays on how and why the main character changed.
