In The Classroom

- ❖ In **math workshop**, students will be comparing and ordering decimals while referring to specific place values and using the number line as a visual model. They will also be rounding decimals to the nearest tenths and hundredths.
- ❖ In reading/writing workshop, students will be finishing up this unit on short stories and literary elements. For the final performance task, they will be reading and annotating "A Bad Road for Cats." Then, they will choose from two options for their written response (character analysis/change or potential themes) and begin to outline their essay.
